
## **Crime and its Elements:**

An act punishable by law as forbidden by statute is known as a crime. A commission or omission which is baneful to the society is a crime. According to Blackstone, a crime is an act done in violation of Public Law.



### Motive is not an essential for a crime.

# **EXCEPTIONS / CRIMINAL LIABILITY**

### **CRIME = Person + Mens rea + Act + Result**.

Some offences have not all these four essentials. It is explained in connection with the concept of Criminal Liability as.....



### = M + A + R (a person is liable for criminal acts of others)

= (P1 + P2) + M + A + R (a person is liable for criminal acts with other persons jointly)

- → Section 34 Acts done by several persons in furtherance of common intention
- $\rightarrow$  Section 120B Punishment of criminal conspiracy
- → Section 149 Every member of unlawful assembly guilty of offence committed in prosecution of common object
- → Section 395 Punishment for dacoity
- → Section 402 Assembling for purpose of committing dacoity

**Vicarious Liability Joint Liability** Inchoate Liability Constructive Liability

**Strict Liability** = P + A + R (a person is liable for criminal acts even though there is no mens-rea)

- → Section 494 Bigamy
- → Section 268 Public Nuisance
- → Section 363 Punishment for kidnapping
- $\rightarrow$  Section 362 Abduction
- $\rightarrow$  Chapter-10: Contempt of Lawful Authority of Public servants.
- → Section 376 Committing rape of a girl (below 16 years of age) with her consent.



- $\rightarrow$  Section 396 & 460


# **STAGES OF CRIME**



## **<u>I. Offences in which INTENTION</u> is punishable**

- Abetments, Criminal Conspiracy Sections 121 to 123: Waging War against the Govt. Section 124: Sedition Section 402: Mere assembly of persons for committing the dacoity without further preparation

## II. Offences in which **PREPARATION** is punishable



- Sections 233 to 235 & 257: Preparation for counterfeiting coins & Govt. stamps
- Sections 242, 243, 259, 266 & 474: Possessing counterfeit coins, false weight or measurement and forged documents



  5. Fine (Sec- 510)
